

Side Curtain Care

Straitline® Side Curtains are manufactured from top quality materials, imported from all over the world, and are designed for New Zealand conditions. We recommend you follow these care and cleaning tips to ensure you get the maximum possible lifespan from your Side Curtains.

Care

Keep your curtains tight! The quickest way to wreck your side curtains is to drive around with them loosely tensioned. Use the tensioners and the buckles to keep them tight, and they will give you a nice long lifespan.

Regular cleaning prevents too much dirt build up, which can permeate non-clear coated PVC to cause permanent discoloration.

Keep repairs up to date. Poorly maintained curtains will leak through their holes, be harder to tension, and look shabby. If they need repair, bring them in to our service bay!

Cleaning

Any form of vehicle cleaning soap is ok to use on your side curtains. If you are unsure, test your cleaning mix in a inconspicuous corner first.

Soft bristle brooms are a great tool for knocking the road grime off after soaping up.

Water blasting is ok, but avoid moving the nozzle too close – 500mm is close enough! Also, try to always keep the nozzle at a 45° angle, don't water blast head on to the curtain.

Avoid harsh chemicals like meths/rubbing alcohol. If a degreaser is required (e.g. to remove road tar etc.) make sure it is diluted as per the manufacturers specification.
